DELIRIS and MOISE serve among Haitian, Central American, and African migrants who have made their new home in Tijuana, Mexico. Moise is a business entrepreneur, and Deliris is a pastor and occupational therapist. They serve with the Baja Regional Baptist Convention "Dios con nosotros" and "Vision de migrantes," an

organization formed by Haitians and Baptist churches interested in helping migrants. Using his skills and ability to speak four different languages, Moise helps migrants and migrant communities achieve their new beginnings. Deliris supports Deborah's House, a ministry for women survivors of domestic violence and their children. They strongly believe that God uses us all wherever we live, and new opportunities are open for those who trust in the Lord.

MINISTRY STORY

God is an amazing artist who has woven together our two distinct ministries—
Deborah's House and supporting migrants—to create something beautiful and new. Migrants do not want to be a burden; they want to work and establish new lives in their new home country.
Working with a Catholic vocational school, Moise recruits students from the Haitian Baptist Church and shelters we serve.
Migrants become residents, find jobs and contribute to their communities.

One of our former "Deborahs" is a teacher at the Vocational School for Migrants and two other Deborahs received training there in entrepreneurship. The coursework empowers migrants and women to develop small businesses using the gifts they already have, which could include cooking, sewing, mechanics, or beauty. The three best projects included one of our Deborahs and a Haitian woman. They each received \$5,000 to improve and continue their businesses.

At Deborah's House, we are serving women and their children who are suffering from domestic violence. Women have come from El Salvador, Guatemala, Venezuela, Honduras and Ecuador. By working with the organization, Al Otro Lado, we've helped 9 families cross legally into the U.S. following an asylum process.

Truly, God is faithful and has a unique way of weaving our ministries together to bring hope to those who are on their journey to freedom. To God be the Glory!
