WALITA has been dedicated to evangelism, discipleship, leadership development, non-formal biblical-theological education, and church planting as an associate global servant since January 1995. She is currently working in Colombia with the churches planted there and as co-director, with her

husband, at La Antorcha Bible Institute. Indigenous leaders, from more than 107 native tribes of Colombia, are trained at La Antorcha to serve their own ethnic groups and the unreached ones. The institute carries out discipleship, basic biblical-theological and missionary training programs. Walita also conducts and promotes short-term crosscultural trips to the institute, to different tribes, and to the churches in vulnerable places in Bogota. She is married with two daughters, and reminds herself, "It's by God's grace, who counted me worthy of his calling, that I am what I am."

MINISTRY STORY

"Granny," as some students fondly call me, since it is very common for indigenous people to have young grandmothers, "I am very happy and grateful because here I have learned to love. The word love doesn't even exist in my language, and here you have not only spoken to me and taught me about love, but you have also shown it to me."

Students repeatedly share these words with me through tears as they prepare to return to their communities or once they are already back home.

At La Antorcha Bible Institute, we live in community with our students, and constantly emphasize to our missionaries that the most important biblical-theological class we can teach is in the way we live and relate to each other. Everything we do, inside and outside the classroom, our daily living, is how we live what we teach among our students. Our motto, based on Ezra 7:10, is "I study, practice, and share the Word of God." Therefore, we focus not only on teaching classes, but on demonstrating our classes to our students through our own lives. This has led us to see how the Word of

God and the gospel of Jesus Christ, lived in the Spirit, produces not only growth in knowledge, but also a transformation of life. We know that this will result in families, communities and ethnic groups being transformed by our loving God.
